



# Giving up the right to regulate VoIP phone service is BAD for Verizon workers. **DON'T LET IT HAPPEN!**

Public Service Commission (PSC) regulation of phone service has helped protect our jobs AND ensure quality service. Even though Verizon has successfully weakened PSC regulations, they are still important. Regulations protect service quality—and Lifeline and rural access requirements add more customers, which means more jobs.

But phone service is moving to VoIP, which is currently unregulated. The PSC is planning to regulate VoIP. That's the good news. Service quality, access and affordability regulations for FiOS Digital Voice would

protect CWA jobs—and VoIP customers. And cable companies would also be regulated.

The bad news is Gov. Cuomo's proposed state budget includes language to permanently prohibit future regulation of VoIP service. Permanent deregulation means the PSC could never act.

Ensuring consumers have service means good jobs. Deregulation has failed both workers and consumers. Call Gov. Cuomo right now. Please leave a message asking him not to permanently deregulate VoIP telephone service.
